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❖ Introduction and context

This document provides introductory guidelines on the functionalities envisaged in the interactive geoportal developed in the framework of the PANACeA project, an Interreg Med funded initiative aiming to strengthen and transfer the work developed by a community of 11 projects on Biodiversity Protection in the Mediterranean.

The Biodiversity Protection Knowledge platform aims to provide access to key information and documents and to visualize spatially the presence of partners in this community of projects and the results of the work implemented affecting various geographical areas.

The geoportal, the main platform tool to visualize spatial data related to biodiversity protection, consists of two main elements:

- I) A Map viewer, where geospatial data can be visualized with different symbolization and individual queries implemented based on metadata (keywords, location, projects...) and data content (registries contained in attribute tables);
- II) A Catalogue view, allowing the user to navigate and discover available geospatial data provided by Med Biodiversity Protection projects and other external relevant institutions included in the Biodiversity Protection Knowledge database through a search engine and filtering tools.

The geoportal will allow users to select and combine various data layers from the Catalogue to visualize and prepare specific maps depending on their needs and objectives, and export the results of individual queries as pdf maps.

Furthermore, the Biodiversity Protection Knowledge platform is being set up to allocate permission to advanced users for data edition and uploads on request.

To complement spatial data, a Library containing documents and multimedia resources developed by the Med community will be accessible and searchable by the platform users.

The Biodiversity Protection Knowledge platform is still under development.

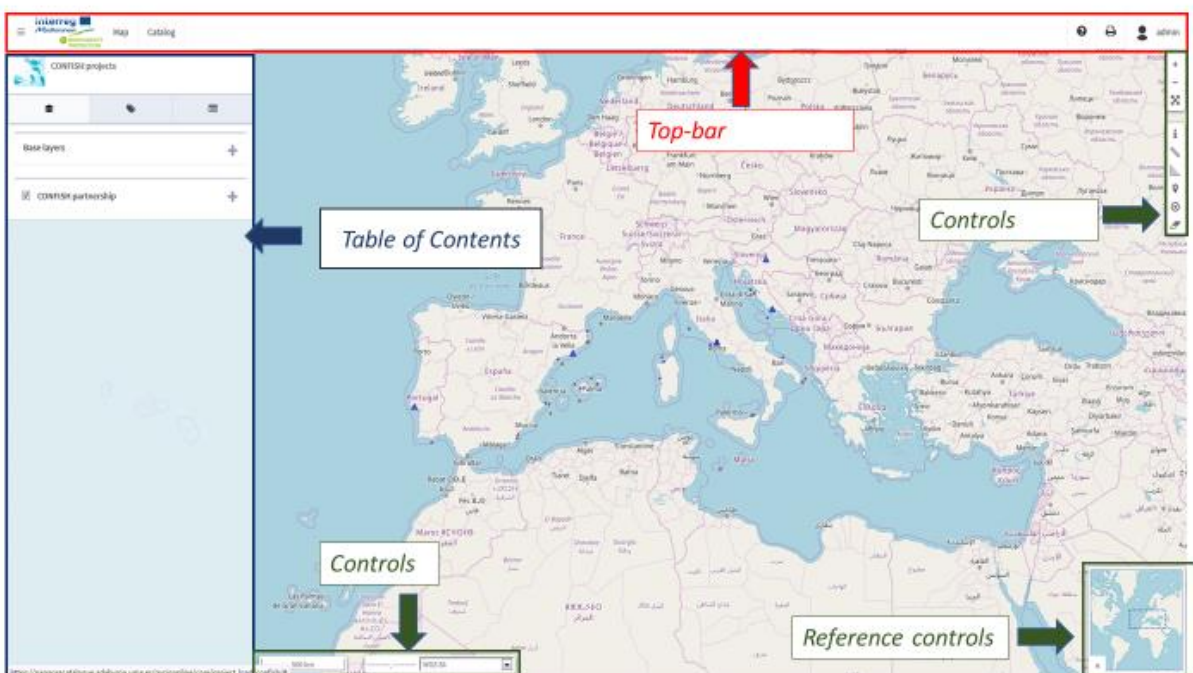
❖ Map viewer

Dedicated composite views can be created for different topics and/or projects. Initial set viewers developed by PANACEa to date are:

1. Institutions active in Med Biodiversity Protection projects
2. Biodiversity protection pilot areas including marine protected areas, monitoring activities and locations where projects have implemented actions
3. Institutions and pilot areas for each of the three working groups in the Med Biodiversity Protection Community
4. Single project maps with partner institutions, pilot sites and areas of work. In November 2018, there are 12 biodiversity protection projects: ACT4LITTER, AMARE, CONFISH, ECOSUSTAIN, FISHMPABLUE2, MEDSEALITTER, MPA-ADAPT, PANACEA, PHAROS4MPAS, PLASTICBUSTERSMPAS, POSBEMED, and WETNET.

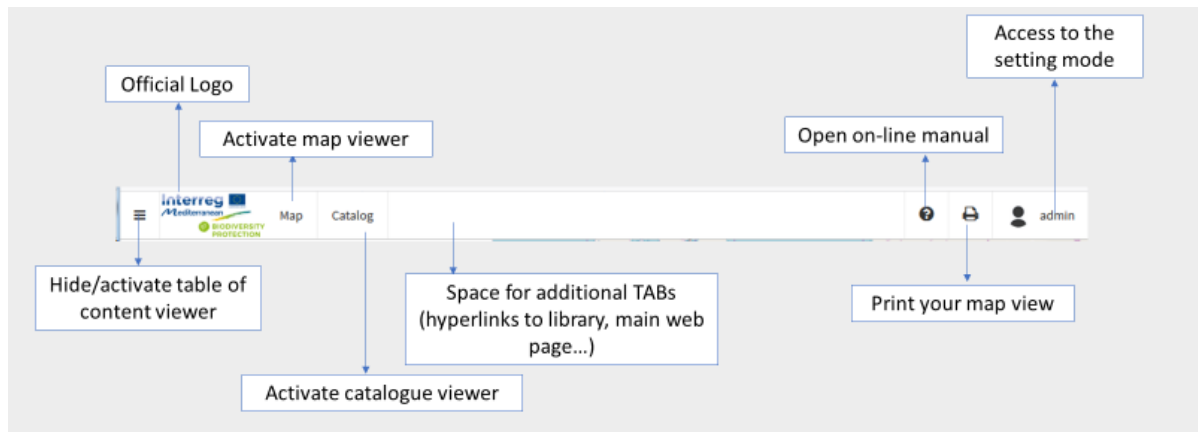
Each predefined viewer will consist of a background map of the Mediterranean and be complemented by the following elements:

- 1) a table of contents with information on the spatial data and layer selected;
- 2) a top-bar with the logo and a menu to other sections in the platform; and
- 3) a set of controls to access information on the points located in the layers.



➤ Top-bar menu

The top-bar is a common element across the geoportal components. It provides a frame and a point of access to the Map Viewer, the Catalogue of spatial data resources and other key sections in the Biodiversity Protection Knowledge Platform such as the future Library of documents and multimedia and an online manual.



➤ Table of Contents

When accessing the Map Viewer, a section on the left will show the Table of contents related to the project/layer/topic selected.

The Table of Contents is displayed in separate windows:

- 1) *The tree layer*
- 2) *The legend, and*
- 3) *The extra info on data (under development).*

▪ Tree layer view

The tree layer window provides detailed information on the available layers in each active map and several interactive options.

The tree layer window is opened by default to display at least the name of the active map viewer, the basic layers to apply as background and the layer data details, as in the example below.

The +/- options allows the user to open the tree structure and access further data details, allowing for the attribute table with selected data to be downloaded as excel file for further use.

Header

- Title and logo of dedicated viewer i.e. project name or topic
- Activate tree layer details window
- Activate legend view of layers selected
- Activate additional content window for pictures, documents, hyperlinks...

Basic layers

- Select a base layer as background to facilitate map interpretation (OpenStreetMaps, Aerial maps...)

Layer data details

- Container name for project/topic, with one or more different data types selected
- Layer name: label of spatial data, with activate/deactivate option
- Layer control tool for edition (only for users with editing rights)
- Pop up window providing key details on data (scope, authors, date, project ...)
- Pop up window showing registered data associated to the selected layer
- Zoom to specific layer resolution
- Change symbology for layer, when more than one is available
- Add transparency to the selected layer to facilitate contrast between layers

Other layers

- Additional data layers available, added by default from the catalogue tab, listed in a compact (symbol +) or extent view (symbol -)

Legend view

The window with the label icon displays the information on the symbols and icons used in the map to visualize information related to projects and their spatial data. This information is important to create captions and export the maps with appropriate legends.

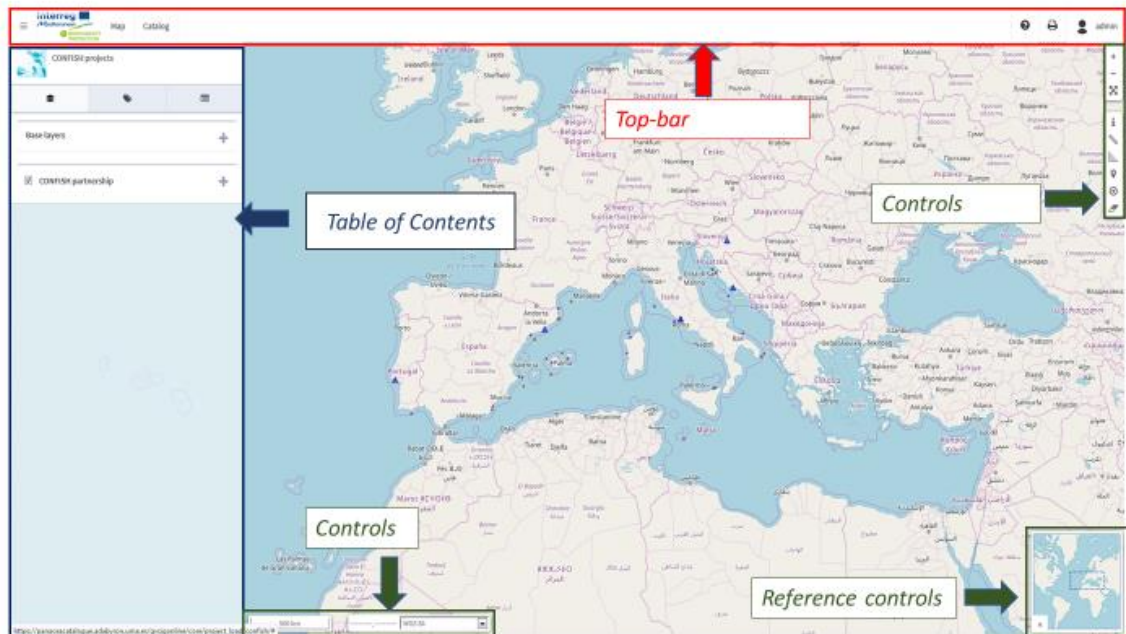

➤ Viewer controls

The control buttons on the right and bottom of the map viewer allow users to perform basic geographic operations, understand the map and interpret the data contained in each geolocation by clicking on the Info button (i).



Once the Info button is active, the user can click on the points marked in the map and a new pop-out window will open giving access to a description and access to information associated to the data selected.
